Work is displayed which is produced by students of a variety of skill levels, academic ability and year group. We make ourselves accessible to all students to discuss their worries or concerns.

Differentiation within the learning environment is essential for each of the above to be realised.

Multicultural

Whatever the nature of the local community, pupils are growing up in a wider multicultural and multiracial society where they are subject to various attitudes towards minority groups, and also certain images of these groups portrayed by the media. The School stands against racism and all forms of discrimination on the grounds of ethnic origin, religion, gender or disability. This is reflected in the Christian foundation of the School.
